

Shalom: Peace in the Waiting Luke 1 Rev. Matthew Harder December 15, 2024

Big Idea: God's peace meets us in the waiting, anchoring our hopein His presence.

Peace in the Waiting | LUKE 1:5-25

Shalom, the Hebrew word for 'peace,' represents the pattern of God's intended reality. But sin, hurt, confusion, and pain tear through our peace with God, leaving us longing for restoration.

CONTEXT: LUKE 1:7-25

Elizabeth and Zechariah lived during a politically unstable and oppressive time under King Herod, yet their faith remained unwavering.

- ⁷ But they were childless because Elizabeth was not able to conceive, and they were both very old.
- ^{13a}But the angel said to him: 'Do not be afraid, Zechariah; your prayer has been heard.

God hears prayers even when they seem forgotten, delayed or unanswered for years.

• ^{13b}Your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you are to call him John.

If our promise doesn't go beyond us then it may not be in God's plan!

• ¹⁸Zechariah asked the angel, 'How can I be sure of this? I am an old man, and my wife is well along in years.

He's not muting the miracle, He's making room for you to see it unfold.

- ²⁴After this his wife Elizabeth became pregnant and for five months remained in seclusion.
- ^{25a}'The Lord has done this for me,' she said.

Even being obedient to naming him John was against customs but it wasn't culture that produced the miracle all Glory to God!!

 \bullet 25b In these days he has shown his favor and taken away my disgrace among the people'

When God shows up, He restores peace and dignity.

1. God is working in the waiting

2. Receive Peace through God's Word

3. Prepare the Way
